The RIHS is one of four of research institutes under the Agency for Research and Development, Ministry of Public Works and Housing of Indonesia.

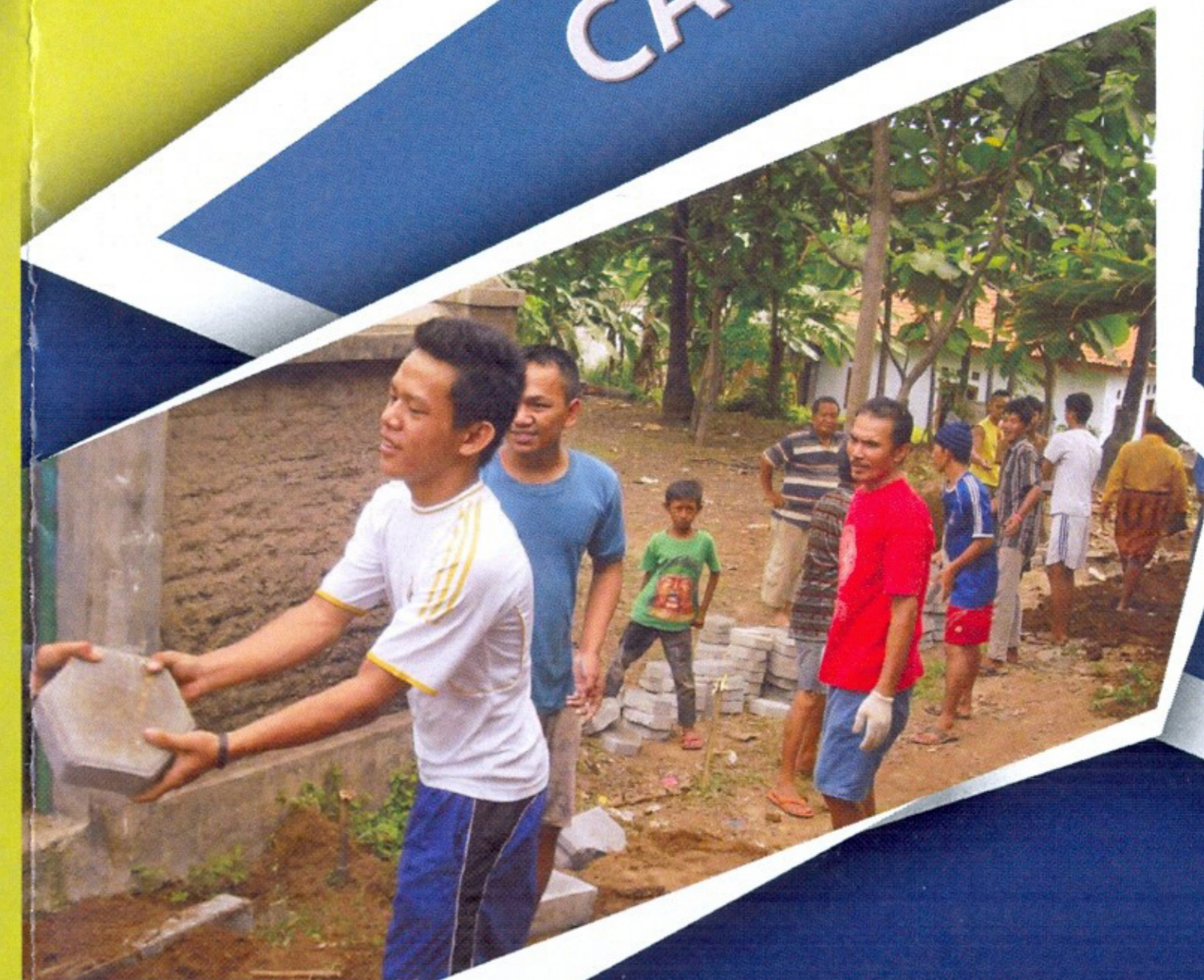

Background

Most cities around the world struggle to accommodate their rising populations and address the multi-dimensional challenges of urban development. Urban development should be guided by a sustainable planning and management vision that promotes interconnected green space, a multi-modal transportation system, and mixed-use development.

To reach global sustainability, Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) for the period 2015 to 2030 will help guide the public's understanding of complex sustainable development challenges, inspire public and private action, promote integrated thinking, and foster accountability. Sustainable urban development means responsible growth and development strategies that are broader in vision and more regional in scale. Diverse public and private partnerships should be used to create sustainable and livable communities.

Many communities around the country need for tools and guidance to help them achieve their desired to improve quality of life, and become more economically and environmentally sustainable. To improve livelihoods and to strengthen local capacity, the existence of partnership is importance. Partnership could be defined as a collaboration working relationship between development professional, government, non-governmental organization, scholars, and local community in which each partner respects the expertise of the other. The partners plan together and work together to achieve mutual goals, sharing information and decision-making responsibilities. 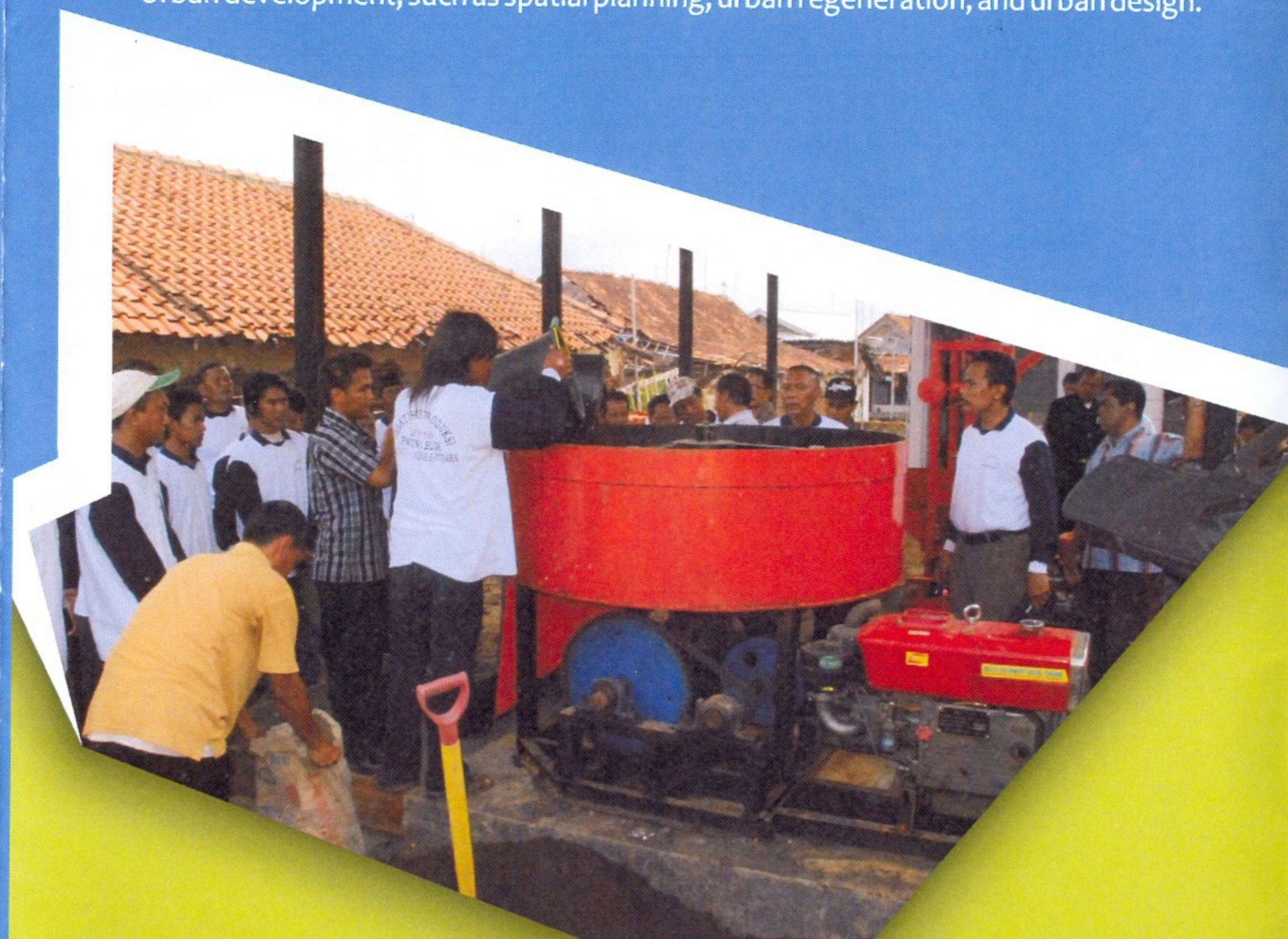
